
10 years of CDRC Vienna - a decade of leading mediation excellence!

The CDRC Vienna was launched in 2015 by the International Bar Association (IBA) and the Vienna International Arbitral Centre (VIAC). It aims to revolutionize dispute resolution by promoting mediation and negotiation as powerful alternatives to litigation.

The IBA-VIAC CDRC has grown into one of the largest mediation and negotiation competitions globally. It is held annually in Vienna, Austria, and we now welcome more than 230 top students, leading international commercial dispute resolution experts, and volunteers to the CDRC. Our participants hail from almost 50 countries, representing all continents and many legal traditions. We are proud to call the IBA-VIAC CDRC a truly global event.



We base the IBA-VIAC CDRC on the current case of the world-renowned Willem C Vis Moot. The background story is: the VIS Moot arbitration has been stayed after the appointment of the arbitral tribunal so that the parties can attempt to mediate a settlement agreement. The case of the Willem C Vis Moot is augmented by additional confidential information that allows our Negotiator Teams to develop their strategies, best offers, and red lines.

The combination of these features results in the near-real mediation and negotiation experience for the competitors.

World-leading dispute resolution experts assess the Mediator and Negotiator Teams. Our Expert Assessors help us score the performances of the competing Teams and provide each student with in-depth, valuable, individualised feedback after each session. This feedback is key to helping the students learn, improve, and grow during the IBA-VIAC CDRC.

The Expert Assessors also share their knowledge and experience in form of learning opportunities and they attend our networking events. Many lasting professional relationships have been forged during the IBA-VIAC CDRC.

In 2023, we hosted the inaugural **IBA-VIAC CDRC Pre-Moot Conference**, and its theme "Reframing Dispute Resolution: Moving beyond Adversarialism and Optimising Outcomes by Melding Mediation and Arbitration" reflected not only the proud tradition of our cooperation with the Vis Moot, but also addressed very current affairs in dispute resolution. In 2025, we will take our 10th anniversary as an opportunity to explore the next decade of mediation. Leading experts will look into the crystal ball and discuss the road ahead, including the challenges and opportunities mediation may face and offer.

Each year, the IBA-VIAC CDRC also organises a **Masterclass, seminars and workshops**. Led by very experienced experts, the **Masterclass** examines the Vis Moot case from different angles and demonstrates how economic analysis can shape the negotiation strategy.







Our seminars and workshops, hosted by global law firms and featuring leading international experts, provide specific insights on topics such as mediation techniques, cross-cultural communication, or mediation strategy.
